



JOSEPH WASSWA LINKING UGANDA TO GERMANY

He went to Germany to study music. While there, he first felt lost, but later found himself when he mobilised fellow students into a cross-cultural music ensemble. Today, Joseph Wasswa is the proud founder of *Himbisa Mukama* (Praise the Lord), an inter-cultural musical initiative that promotes music and cultural understanding between Uganda and Germany. Complete with an affiliate ensemble, which blends western (classical) and African music, Wasswa and his team have traversed Germany and recently, Uganda, promoting inter-cultural music initiatives and supporting church music projects in his home area of Masaka, writes Mathias Mazinga

First, he thought he would become a priest. But his journey to priesthood was short-lived. Joseph Wasswa left Bukalasa Minor Seminary after only six years and joined Makerere University. Here, he enrolled for a bachelor's degree in music. He passed with a first class.

In 2007, Wasswa got a scholarship to pursue a master's degree in music at the University of Church Music, Regensburg, Germany. But then, something happened.

"While in Germany, I noted that some Germans had misconceptions about Uganda and Africa," he says. "I discovered, for instance, that many local people knew nothing about Uganda. They also did not believe an African could do anything remarkable."

This disheartened him: "I felt like returning home," he says.

The situation was worsened by the cold weather and his inability to speak German: "I wanted to cry."

Wasswa soon found out the reason for the cultural disconnect: "I realised that it was the lack of inter-cultural understanding between Europeans and Africans that led to misconceptions about each other," he says.

Himbisa Mukama

To educate his German community about Uganda and its potential, in 2012, Wasswa mobilised fellow German students into a choir.

"I asked students to set up a platform for the integration of cultures." With endorsement from the university church, where he was an organist, he formed an 80-member choral ensemble and gave it a Kinyankore name, *Himbisa Mukama* (Praise the Lord).

Wasswa became the music director of the ensemble, which included a choir, orchestra and band. He re-arranged Ugandan church music pieces like *Rugayo*, *Himbisa Mukama*, *Agutamba* and *Natendanga Omukama* and fused

them with German music genre, producing a rich musical repertoire.

From the inception of this ensemble, Wasswa and his team traversed German cities, singing and playing African and Western music. His ensemble became popular and caught the eye of some prominent German politicians. They later formed a non-government organisation, *Foerderverein Fuer Musik und Kultur, Uganda e.V.*, to promote music and cross-cultural understanding.

Changing lives

In 2012, Wasswa organised a concert with *Himbisa Mukama* choir at the Catholic Church of Dreifaltigkeit, Germany, to which local parishioners made financial contributions.

He used the proceeds to start a music school and cultural centre for needy children in Masaka and to renovate the pipe-organ at Kitovu Cathedral in Masaka.

In 2014, the ensemble held

another concert at Dreifaltigkeits Church.

This featured over 200 musicians from *Himbisa Mukama* and the Uganda Catholic Centenary Memorial Choir. It attracted over 1,500 people from German cities like Munich, Deggendorf, Passau, Kuemmersbruck, Lappersdorf and Berlin. Some of the money raised in this concert was used to support their NGO.

Meeting the German Chancellor
In 2014, Wasswa met the Chancellor of Germany, Angela Merkel.

"Merkel had read about me and my inter-cultural projects in the press. So, she invited me to a dialogue about international relations in Berlin. The convention was attended by presidents and dignitaries from countries like France and Canada. I talked about Africa, in particular the native Ugandan musical genres and cultures," he recalls.

The group has since become widely known and respected in different parts of the country.

Even before going to Germany, Wasswa proved his worth as a musician of international repute.

In 2005, as the East African Community looked for the bloc's anthem, Wasswa, then a student at Makerere, wrote an anthem, which was chosen as the best from Uganda.

The melody and lyrics of his anthem brought out most clearly the theme of East African unity and development as observed by Bakaye Lubega, Uganda's former principal cultural officer, now at the East African Community headquarters in Arusha. Although his anthem was not selected, Wasswa scooped the third prize at the regional level.

Last year, Wasswa established a partnership with the Uganda Catholic Centenary Memorial Choir and organised a concert with Himbisa Mukama choir in Germany. Wasswa later organised a two-week musical tour of Himbisa Mukama in Uganda. The choir held concerts with Cacemcho at Pope Paul Memorial Hotel, Ndeeba on August 30 and at Mariaflo Hotel, Masaka on September 6, 2015.

MUSIC SCHOOL

Wasswa plans to set up a modern music school in Masaka.

"We acquired land at Bwala in Masaka and construction of the school will start soon. The school will also teach international languages like German, Italian and French.

"We conceived the idea after realising that many young Ugandans lacked the opportunity to develop their talents. Today, musicians are well-paid. This intangible wealth should be open to everyone," he said.

Who is Wasswa?

Wasswa was born on October 30, 1985 to Charles Matovu Kabulassooke (RIP), who was a local council chairman of Nnyendo-Ssenyange division in Masaka.

He attended Nyendo Public School and Bukalasa Minor Seminary (1998-2004), where he was introduced to the piano by Fr. Dr. Joseph Namukangula. He later went to Makerere University for his Bachelor of Music Degree (2005-2007) and graduated with a first class degree.

In 2007, Wasswa won a scholarship to pursue a master's degree at the University of Regensburg, Germany. This is the university where Pope Benedict lectured before he became Pontiff.

Wasswa is currently doing another master's degree (in cultural sciences, politics and
